

Bio Sketch of Marilyn A. Ray, Class of 1958



I, Marilyn Anne "Dee" Ray, RN, BSN, MSN, MA (Anthro), PhD, CTN-A, FSfAA, FAAN, FESPCH (hon) am a Professor Emeritus and Adjunct Professor at Florida Atlantic University, Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing, Boca Raton, Florida, USA.

I wish to thank my classmates and President Cheryl McQueen for this honour to share my story of nursing since graduating from St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing in 1958. I was born in Hamilton, Ontario and became a student nurse at St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing in 1955.

My roommate and friend for three years was Diane Valliere Losier. I was selected as the Red Rose Queen with my classmates Maddie Rowe and Gail Armstrong Bjornsen at graduation in 1958. In late fall of the same year a group of us went to Los Angeles, California and worked at UCLA Medical Center where we were introduced to interesting areas of practice. Many other classmates joined us. Some stayed and many went home.

I decided to stay in the United States and return to school as encouraged earlier by Sister Virginia Hanlon. By the grace of God, my personal life and professional career was full of many opportunities and challenges. I got my Bachelor and Master of Science degrees in Nursing from the University of Colorado, Denver, Colorado, graduating in 1968 and 1969 respectively. I was a mentee of the late Dr. Madeleine Leininger, the first nurse-anthropologist, and founder of Transcultural Nursing, and after teaching in California and also the Nurse Practitioner Program at McMaster University, I became Leininger's first student in transcultural nursing acquiring my Doctor of Philosophy degree at the University of Utah in 1981. My research on contemporary nursing culture facilitated the discovery of the Theory of Bureaucratic Caring, the interrelationship and synthesis of caring as spiritual, ethical and humanistic and the hospital culture/context as political, economic, technological, legal and sociocultural. In 1979, I met and married my late husband, James L. Droesbeke, an accountant. I was a faculty member at the University of Colorado with Dr. Jean Watson advancing "caring as the essence of nursing." I was recruited to Florida Atlantic University, Boca Raton, Florida in 1989 where I have remained and have held the positions of Eminent Scholar and Professor in caring science, education, administration, and research. I guess you can say, I love nursing, caring science, and teaching. I am a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing (FAAN), and certified as an Advanced Transcultural Nurse (CTN-A). After becoming a United States' citizen, I had a parallel career and served in the United States Air Force Reserve Nurse Corps (USAFR, NC) for 32 years in the field of aerospace nursing. I have written books, the latest, "Transcultural Caring Dynamics in Nursing and Health Care." My Archives of Caring are housed in the Museum at the Christine E. Lynn College of Nursing, Florida Atlantic University. I love to come home to Canada and visit with my friends and family and extended families -- Michael (Windsor), Pat (Montreal), Mary (Burlington), Cathy (a graduate of St. Joseph School of Nursing, Class of 1965, Peterborough), and Loretta (Hamilton). I enjoy visiting McMaster University, Faculty of Nursing and have set up an award, Excellence in Nurse Practitioner Education and Practice for nurse practitioner students or faculty. I am especially excited about celebrating with my classmates our 60th anniversary of graduation from our esteemed St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing this coming May 2018. I believe that SJH School of Nursing through education and service provided me with a solid foundation for advancing holistic caring as the essence of nursing.





CALL FOR HISTORICAL ARCHIVES ST. JOSEPH'S SCHOOL OF NURSING HAMILTON ONTARIO



TOAST TO THE ALMA MATER LOIS RENWICK '68

Welcome Sisters, Special Guests and Members of the Alumnae.

I am honoured to speak to you today on behalf of the class of 1968. We are celebrating a milestone year! 50 years have passed by since our graduation from St Joseph's School of Nursing. I would like to thank the organizing committee for asking me to represent our class. I also want to thank the committee for their time, energy and dedication in planning this very special celebration.

In the past few months, I have had the opportunity and the pleasure of speaking with many of my classmates. It is interesting, that although we haven't spoken in years, when we hear each others voice, it is like time has stood still. Such is the result of living together in close quarters, sharing everything - our stories, our laughter and tears - and often even our clothes! It is so true that the first one out is the best one dressed!

My mother-in-law used to say: "life is like a roll of toilet paper, the closer you get to the end, the faster it goes!" And here we are, 50 years later feeling like it was yesterday! I guess we are getting close to the end of our roll!

Reflecting back a half century is no easy task. I revisited my old yearbooks to refresh my aging memory. Margaretta Papp in her editor's message in our 1968 Vox Omnium quoted WB Yeats:

"When you are old and grey, And full of sleep, Nodding by the fire, Take down this book And slowly read..."This is perfect advice for our 50th anniversary. So when you go home - take down your yearbooks and remember when...and make sure you have a box of Kleenex close by! It is a real trip down memory lane, and of course, we haven't changed a bit!

In 1965, the year we entered nursing. St Joseph's Hospital marked its 75th year. Sister Mary Grace was the hospital administrator. She advised that electronics, automation, computerization and constant research were to be part of the new era of which we were to be the pioneers. Further, she said we would need faith, courage and knowledge to face these new challenges. As insightful and profound as these words were at the time am sure none of us had any idea of how technological change would impact our chosen profession.

As graduates of 1968, we were the pioneers of a new era. The torch was passed! At our graduation, well accepted the challenge and the responsibility, as registered nurses, to meet the demands of advanced technology and constant change. What we were experiencing in 1968 was just the tip of the iceberg - we had no idea of how rapid advancement in science and technology, and dramatic social and cultural change would affect our careers! It was an exciting time to be on the edge of an explosion!

Many of the grads of '68 continued their education obtaining university diplomas and degrees. Some took advanced courses in hospital administration, teaching, industrial nursing and public health. Others specialized in computer science, dialysis, labour and delivery and emergency room nursing. Among our graduates are entrepreneurs, teachers, nursing administrators and managers, nurse anesthesiologist and a director with the Ontario Occupational Health Nurses Association. Not bad! I think Sister Mary Grace would be proud!

I am so grateful and appreciative to have had the opportunity to become a registered nurse and to have graduated with the class of 1968. We owe a great debt to all of our instructors and administrators at St. Joseph's, We especially want to thank Sister Joan O'Sullivan and Sister Ann Marshall, who taught us and nurtured us through our training years. We appreciate the many extra luxuries that are ours here at St. Joseph's because of your generosity and hard work.


