Sister Virginia Hanlon

Sister Virginia Hanlon was born Mary Clare Hanlon on September 1, 1923 in Guelph Ontario. She had 3 sisters, Rita, Katherine and Patricia. She attended Loretto Academy in Hamilton, graduating in 1942. Mary Clare entered St. Joseph's School of Nursing in September 1943 and graduated in 1945. She entered the St. Joseph's Convent in Hamilton in September 1945. She completed her B.Sc. in Nursing at St. Francis Xavier University in Antigonish Nova Scotia. She was known for the famous words: "THE DOOR THAT LET YOU IN WILL LET YOU OUT"

Her accomplishments include

- · Teaching at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton 1951-1957
- · Director of St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton, 1957-1964
- Being involved with the construction of Fontbonne School of Nursing and Fontbonne Residence 1962
- · Establishing a Health Program for Students and Staff (Immunization for Staff)
- Teaching at St. Mary's School of Nursing, Kitchener 1964-1967
- Director of Nursing St. Mary's School of Nursing, Kitchener 1967-1972
- · President and C.E.O. St. Mary's Hospital, Kitchener 1972-1976
- · C.E.O. St. Joseph's Home, Guelph 1976-1984
- Administrative Staff at St. Joseph's Villa, Dundas 1984-2005

Her legacy includes

- · She became Sister Liaison to our Alumnae in 1986
- The Annual Mass of Remembrance was moved from Remembrance Day to the day of the Annual Nursing Reunion.
- . Sister kept in touch with so many people and if she didn't know someone or where they were, she knew who to ask
- Sister had an amazing memory of names of graduates and events and was a valuable resource for archives
- . She was responsible for having our Alumnae Executive meetings at the Villa
- . She was instrumental in obtaining better education for nursing students as well as instructors
- She pioneered and advanced the education of the student nurse from Hospital Nursing Service to Nursing Theory in nursing
- She advanced the St. Joseph's School of Nursing in Canadian Healthcare Education and Administration

Sister Virginia entered Eternal Life on December 26, 2018

Cheryl Gravelin McQueen '66

Cheryl was born on May 23, 1944 in Flin Flon Manitoba. Her family moved to Hamilton Ontario where she attended Cathedral Girls High School. She then entered St Joseph's School of Nursing and graduated with the Class of 1966.



After graduation she worked in Hemodialysis under Dr Art Shimizu and Head Nurse Marianne Stepanik '63. In early 1968, she moved to the Canadian Arctic and worked in two nursing stations, Tuktoyaktuk and Fort Franklin, in conjunction with her position as Head Nurse of Pediatrics at Inuvik General Hospital, Inuvik, N.W.T.

While in the Arctic, she survived a plane crash.
Three years later, she went to Europe and worked
for a short time in the Clinica Mediterranea in
Naples, Italy.

She returned to Canada, worked at Soldiers' Memorial Hospital, in Orillia, the Hamilton Psychiatric Hospital, in Hamilton, and at McMaster University

Medical Centre, in the Emergency Room.

She met and married Nairn McQueen, a Chemical Engineer, and shortly afterwards moved to Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. There she worked in ICU, CCU and ER both at Saskatoon City Hospital and the University Hospital. In 1986 she returned to the Hamilton area where she worked as a Nurse and as a Coordinator of Education at St. Joseph's Villa, Dundas. In September 1988, the Sisters of St Joseph (Sister Ann Marshall's Council) approached her and asked if she would head a pilot project to assess and determine the needs of the bereaved in the Hamilton area.



Over the next 7 years, she developed bereavement programs in parishes, communities, funeral homes, federal

penitentiaries and Indian Reserves throughout Canada. During this time, she enrolled in Theology at the University of Toronto and studied under Dr. Alan Wolfelt, Theologist at the Center for Loss and Life Transition in Colorado. Cheryl trained in Crisis Intervention for Schools and Colleges in Washington D.C. She received her Master of Arts in Ministry and Spirituality degree in November 1995.

In 1993, she branched out on her own and established Bereavement Services Support and Education, a professional organization that provided grief counselling to the bereaved. Within a short time and with sixteen qualified facilitators on staff, she established a website, www.breavement.net, to help with the demand for this service. She created manuals used in bereavement groups and also authored four grief books.

She has also established Coping with Grief and Loss, , a weekly educational discussion

series, for Cattel, Eaton & Chambers Funeral Home in Dundas and for R.H.B. Anderson Funeral Home Ltd. in Hagersville, Fisherville and Ohsweken. Cheryl was a proud member of St. Joseph's School of Nursing Alumnae Association, where she served many roles. She became Newsletter Editor in 2002 and held that position until October 2018. From 2003-2004, she served as Vice President and in 2005 she assumed the role of President and remained in that position until September 2018. During this time, 2006-2007, she served as the Website Coordinator, when our Alumnae website was established. Cheryl became Past President in September 2018.

Cheryl was proud mother to two sons and grandmother of four. She loved travelling the world with Nairn, and together they travelled to more than 60 countries. She enjoyed monthly lunches with her friends, scrapbooking and brunches with her grandchildren. She was an avid baker, poetess and a fan of the Toronto Blue Jays. She was a gracious and loving hostess. Sadly, Cheryl passed away peacefully on August 14, 2019, surrounded by her loving family. She is missed!



Toast To The Alma Mater by Karen Wilson Martin '69

Nursing education at St. Joseph's Hospital occurred between 1911 and 1978 with the first graduation being held in 1915. Our last graduation was in 1978. That was 41 years ago!

Today, we have 335 attending our annual reunion day luncheon, with graduates from Canada, the United States and Australia and classes representing a span of 35 years (1943-1978) Did I say that we have not had a graduate since 1978? Isn't this amazing? it is a tribute to each of you!

I was wondering about this while I was looking at some photos of our (1969) graduation. There was a photo of Sister Grace Stevens '34 (Administrator of St. Joseph's Hospital), Sister Joan O'Sullivan '43 (Director of Nursing Service, St. Joseph's Hospital) and Sister Ann Marshall '56 (Director of St. Joseph's School of Nursing). I began to think of the **people** who made a difference to us as students at St. Joseph's School of Nursing and later as graduates. Many of our faculty were St. Joseph's grads (think of all those who were involved in your nursing education) such as Sister Virginia Hanlon '45, Isabel Kerr '60, Betty McInnes '53, Marie Yakimoff '54 and many more. Consider those grads who were in charge of nursing units or who mentored us, such as Ivy Hart '40, Donna Gravis '46, Eva Staneff '51, Judy Skarrett '62 and many more. Consider other nurses who influenced your development and performance as a nurse. As graduates, remember those you met and continue to meet at the Annual Reunion Day Mass and Dinner/Luncheon.

During our time at St. Joseph's, we were started on the road of discovery as to who we were and what we would become. The experiences and relationships with the Sisters of St. Joseph's, our educators, classmates, patients (now clients), all of these would help to define our existence both then and now. In short it molded us into what we would become. To paraphrase Sir Isaac Newton - *If we have been successful in this life, this career, it has been by standing upon the shoulders of giants* (our faculty and all those nursing graduates who preceded us).

I would ask you to stand, if you are able, to toast our Alma Mater. "To St. Joseph's School of Nursing!"




