come forward to sustain St. Joseph's in Hamilton as one of the most active Schools of Nursing Alumnae in Canada!







St. Joe's Grads Making a Difference

Nancy Manninen Jacko '73

Nancy is a graduate pf St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Class of 1973 as well as a graduate from the University of Windsor. She worked in Critical Care and Public Health at the beginning of her career in the Hamilton and Toronto area. In 1980, Nancy joined the hospital system in North Bay where she held various management roles. Since 1997 until retirement, Nancy had been a member of the senior administrative team with responsibility for numerous clinical programs and participated in corporate planning and goal setting. She led the inaugural strategic planning process for the newly amalgamated North Bay Regional Health Centre and developed the first corporate score card for the organization.



Nancy served on many hospital, local, LHIN and provincial Boards and committees such as a Family Health Team, the Ontario Hospital Association and the Canadian Military. She presented at various district, regional, provincial and international conferences on various topics related to health care. In 2011, Nancy was honoured to receive the Influential Women of Northern Ontario award for the Public Sector in recognition of her leadership in health care. She was also recognized in 2019 by the Canadian College of Health Leaders of North Eastern Ontario as a Difference Maker in the field of

Healthcare. In March 2020, she was awarded the Davedi Order of Merit for her contribution to healthcare in the community.

Nancy retired from the North Bay regional Health Centre in December 2014 where she was Vice President and Chief Nursing Executive. On retirement, she managed a project with the North East LHIN implementing Quality Based Procedures across the region and also did private consulting. Nancy had a progressively varied career in healthcare spanning 43 years, including two hospital corporate amalgamations and the planning and moving to a new hospital in 2011. She led several initiatives to achieve operational and systemic efficiencies and processes for truly patient centered care.

Nancy was also an active member of the community involved in various volunteer activities. She was the Chair of the Board of the North Bay Parry Sound District Public Health Unit and was a member of the Northern Ontario School of Medicine Board from 2016. She also sat on the Governance Committee and chaired the Nominations Relations Sub-Committee.

Nancy returned to clinical practice during the pandemic to vaccinate members of her community as part of the public health team.


Nancy always said nursing was "the best job in the world" as she prepared to celebrate her 50th year in the profession and graduation from St. Joseph's School of Nursing.

Sadly, Nancy passed away untimely on November 30, 2022 at the age of 70, leaving behind her husband Bill, of 46 years, a daughter, Hilary (Mike) and 2 grandchildren, Camdin and Blakely, the loves of her life.



Kathy Templeton Levy '74 is the coach of the Hamilton Knot A Breast Dragon Boat paddling team, which she founded for breast cancer survivors. After 2 bouts of breast cancer herself, she was looking for the support that would help her work through her fear. A paddle team became the way for her to deal with it.

In 1998 she took a leap of faith and borrowed a dragon boat from the local Hamilton area Chinese community. She had learned to paddle herself and



In 2010, Knot a Breast won the International Breast Cancer Dragon Boat Challenge, defeating 73 teams from around the world. That success resulted in Levy being asked to join the Canadian National Dragon Boat team in Germany for the World Championships where she steered the Women's Grand Masters Boat and the Grand Masters Mixed Boat to Gold Medals. The Knot a Breast team has continued to have success and last year, after a 2 year layoff because of Covid, they won the 2022 World Cup Crew Championships in Sarasota, Florida.

Kathy describes the members as a floating support group. "Our focus may be dragon boating, but we are also attuned to the individual needs and the collective fear of our teammates. We know that we are all in the same boat...but with the strength of each other, we are not alone." The sport is an inspiration to their families who have bonded and support each other. A large number help at practices and races and some have even learned to steer.

Kathy is an inspiring speaker. "Our dragon boat team is full of passion, pride and determination. We have each other to share our joy, hope, excitement, fear and sorrow with.

Although this disease has and continues to ravage our lives in so many ways, my crew mates and I have come to realize that when we get out on the water and stroke together, strive to compete and to live, for a brief moment in time, all other concerns are gone; we are alive and we have won."


Did You Know? (facts from the history of the School of Nursing)

In 1956, ward assignments for students were reduced from 12 hours to 8 hours. This was initiated with the Class of 1958

In 1963, Fontbonne Hall opened as the Student Nurses' residence. First year students were still housed in Undermount.

In the 1960's, the emphasis on nursing education shifted to acquiring theory before undertaking the practice. The School of Nursing was held in high regard and it was an innovative school for self-directed learning. National and international visitors visited to see how it was implemented.

In 1973, the Ministry of Colleges and Universities issued a decision to move diploma nursing programs from hospitals to community colleges. The transfer occurred on September 1, 1973. Graduation for the Class of 1973 was the **last nursing graduation under the auspices of St. Joseph's Hospital.** Graduates of this class received their diplomas and pins from St. Joseph's School of Nursing and this Spring 2023, they will celebrate their 50th Year Anniversary.





Marilyn Ruth Annable ElBestawi '73

I was raised on a 100 acre dairy farm in Grimsby ON. where there were a few of us and not a lot of money for non-essentials. I credit this upbringing with my knack for innovation and seeing things in a different way. My interview prior to being accepted at St. Joseph's School of Nursing was intimidating. I told the interviewers that "I wanted to cure cancer". Clearly from the start I had the impression that nurses could do anything! It was a happy day when I received my acceptance letter.





After ten years on Coronary Care, I decided to return to school. Not sure what I wanted to do with my career, I took a general Bachelor of Science degree at University of Guelph and finished it at the University of Waterloo. At this point, I got married and moved to Mississauga. I was fortunate to get a casual position in the ICU at Queensway General in Etobicoke. After hours there were no on-site medical staff other than the ER physician. I moved to part-time, then full-time and after three years, I was hired as Nurse Manager of one of the surgical units. There were so many new experiences in quality initiatives, staff hiring, managing performances, complaints management, communications and trouble shooting. My job expanded from a 23 bed unit to a 56 bed unit. With a colleague, we undertook a new initiative that we called "The Ortho Express", which was a new way of managing hip fracture patients. Our program won the City of Etobicoke Award for Business Excellence, Innovative Category. Following that, I was appointed Director of Surgery and later Vice President Inpatient and Ambulatory Services until 1998. During my "Queensway days", I completed my Certified Health Executive designation with the Canadian College of Health Leaders. Once my role at Queensway General ended, I completed my Master's degree in Health

Dr. Arthur Shimizu

Dr. "Art" Shimizu was a Professor of Clinical Medicine at McMaster University, specializing in Nephrology. He was pivotal in the development of St. Joseph's Kidney and Urinary Program. He was founder and leader in the Department of Nephrology and he was appointed head of the first chronic dialysis unit in Ontario at St.Joseph's in Hamilton in 1967.

He was a pioneer in the field of Kidney Transplant and Dialysis. He laid the foundation for the innovative patient centred regional dialysis program which continues to grow at St. Joseph's.

He was largely responsible for the advancement of Kidney Care in the Niagara Region as well and was instrumental in the development of medical education both pre and post-graduate in the region. He taught many who are practicing world wide.

He empathized for the less fortunate and he set an example for everyone that touched his life. He was known as an outstanding physician, clinician and researcher. Many of us will remember him as a "little guy" in his white lab coat, who raced around and had a great patient bedside manner and was always with his entourage of students, etc....Dr. Shimizu passed away on October 20, 2022, at the age of 93, after a prolonged illness.




