

It is with fond memories that we will always remember Friday December 18th, 1959. It was this day we received our caps.




We had reached our first goal and we pray with God's help, during the next three years we may become nurses that our hospital will be proud to call "Graduates of St. Joseph's School of Nursing."





A proof it is and token, 'Our cap of spotless white, Of love and tender care, A symbol of truth and light.




At various intervals throughout the nativity Scene the Choir sang Angels We have Heard On High, and We Three Kings

San Affiliation

Each month six students from St. Joseph' Hospital affiliate at the Hamilton Sanitorium.

The numerous buildings on the sanitorium grounds were at one time used for patients with tuberculosis, but now, because of drug therapy and earlier discovery of tuberculosis, patients require treatment for a much shorter period of time, and due to this, many of the buildings at the sanitorium

The Sanitorium unit includes the Chedoke Hospital and the Brow Infirmary.

While on affiliation students live in Holbrook Residence, a pleasant modern building with large airy rooms for study,

Approximately half of the course is spent at the T.B. centre and the other half in rehabilitation at the Brow Infirmary. The time spent on the wards at the two centres, is balanced with classes and assignments. The instructors are patient and helpful, as are the nurses on the wards.

Recently the Sanitorium has housed many Eskimos suffering from tuberculosis. It is interesting to work with these people and observe their activities and hobbies. Many clever carvings are done by the adults. The children attend school for six hours a day in the classroom provided.

There is a great deal for student nurses to learn about tuberculosis, since surveys prove that it is still presenting a very real problem. The time spent at the rehabilitation centre proves especially beneficial on return to our general hospitals, where many elderly people are being cared for.

The sanitorium affiliation is one that every student who is able to go, should use and appreciate to their fullest extent.



July 31st, 1961; a day never to be forgotten by the Class of '62! - the official presentation of our black bands.



Our Proposed Residence

With the first stages of the expansion programme of St. Joseph's Hospital underway, we, the student nurses watched with equal interest for the first turning of the sod behind Undermount Residence which would indicate the beginning of the construction of our new nurse's residence.

It had been evident from the beginning that the stately old Oakbank residence would have to be demolished to make way for the new residence. Even after its demolition, the happy memories of our good times shared together there within its spacious rooms will still linger on.

The huge shade trees were uprooted in quick succession. The excavation had begun. The quiet gardens had been replaced by the machines and the turmoil that accompanies a major construction project.

During the following months the steel structures of the addition began to rise.

From James Street one will enter the new residence which is twin-like in appearance to the new hospital with its blue glazed brickwork and modern architecture.

There will be elevator service to carry one to any floor of this eight storey structure or stairs for those individuals who are ardently desirous of exercise.

Lockers, linen and trunk rooms and storage area will be contained in the basement.

The reception room with its comfortable modern furnishings and planters with perhaps some Virginia Creeper growing amongst the plants and ivy's will provide a friendly homey atmosphere for our guests and visitors.

Further along the hallway will be the offices of the Director of Nurses, Director of Education, and the Instructors, and the Board Room. First floor will also house three classrooms, a library, a science and dissecting room and rooms for nursing instructions and practice.

Each of the seven floors will have a sitting room and there will be accommodations for a hairdressing unit on alternating floors, and a few kitchenettes.

Both private and semi-private bedrooms will be available. Each of these rooms will have a desk and dresser combination, a full length mirror, a sink, bookcase, ample clothes closet space, adequate lighting, and matching curtains and bedspread.


The residence and hospital will be equipped with a public address system, and electric simultaneously synchronized clocks.

Probably the most alluring floor to us will be the recreational roof area. Here we shall be able to relax in our off duty hours and be free from the trials and tribulations of the day. What could be more enjoyable than a barbeque party or getting a tan on the sun deck? It would surely aid in preventing that anemic-like appearance most of us develop from getting an insufficient amount of sunlight. For those wishing to repose, there will be a quiet area or a music and television room, and a recreation for those more athletically inclined.

Now it is only a matter of time until the completion of this commendable project.

With enthusiasm and anticipation we are awaiting the autumn of 1962; the cutting of the ribbon, and the official announcement of the opening of the new residence which will be our home while we are student nurses in St. Joseph's School of Nursing in Hamilton, Ontario.






Our personal sentiments were expressed through the presentation of a lovely corsage to each mother.


Through the hall of St. Joe's Hospital Trip the Class of 62 With their long white aprons hanging To the toes of Cuban shoes


