Dear Miss Brooks:

Your application has been accepted to enter St. Joseph's School of Nursing during the first week of September. You will be notified in August by letter as to the exact date and time to register.

If, in the event that you should fail all your Grade 13 examinations, the Admission and Selection Committee will reassess your application.

As we are awaiting final price adjustments regarding uniforms, we have not included the order form. We will forward it to you as soon as we receive final instructions from the Company.

Please bring the following articles:

1. A moderate amount of underclothing, plainly marked with woven tapes (name tapes will be sent to you with your uniforms).
2. A housecoat and bedroom slippers.
3. Two pairs of nurses' white shoes with flat heels. Wedgies or pointed toes are not acceptable; only the type of shoe on the enclosed illustration is recommended.
4. White nylon stockings.
5. Plain white ~~one~~ sweater *may be purchased from School after Registration Day*
6. A laundry bag, towels, wash cloths, hangers, soap, hot water bottle.
7. A watch with a second hand, suitable for nurses' use, also an alarm clock.
8. A ball-point pen and eversharp pencil, clipboard, set of coloured pencils, two three-ring note books, (one with lined refills).

Nursing students must have their hair cut short above the collar -- no bangs.

A plastic apron which is required for laboratory work may be purchased from the School of Nursing after registration day.

One Hundred and Twenty-five Dollars (\$125.00) is payable on registration to cover the cost of text books, printed notes, library facilities, lab. fees, etc., during your three years of study. This is not refundable after ten days. All uniforms, caps, school insignia and books are to be returned to the school authorities when a student is dismissed or leaves for any reason before graduation.

We look forward to having you in our school.

Toast To The Alma Mater by Karen Wilson Martin '69

Nursing education at St. Joseph's Hospital occurred between 1911 and 1978 with the first graduation being held in 1915. Our last graduation was in 1978. That was 41 years ago!
Today, we have 335 attending our annual reunion day luncheon, with graduates from Canada, the United States and Australia and classes representing a span of 35 years (1943-1978) Did I say that we have not had a graduate since 1978? Isn't this amazing? it is a tribute to each of you!

I was wondering about this while I was looking at some photos of our (1969) graduation. There was a photo of Sister Grace Stevens '34 (Administrator of St. Joseph's Hospital), Sister Joan O'Sullivan '43 (Director of Nursing Service, St. Joseph's Hospital) and Sister Ann Marshall '56 (Director of St. Joseph's School of Nursing). I began to think of the **people** who made a difference to us as students at St. Joseph's School of Nursing and later as graduates. Many of our faculty were St. Joseph's grads (think of all those who were involved in your nursing education) such as Sister Virginia Hanlon '45, Isabel Kerr '60, Betty McInnes '53, Marie Yakimoff '54 and many more. Consider those grads who were in charge of nursing units or who mentored us, such as Ivy Hart '40, Donna Gravis '46, Eva Staneff '51, Judy Skarrett '62 and many more. Consider other nurses who influenced your development and performance as a nurse. As graduates, remember those you met and continue to meet at the Annual Reunion Day Mass and Dinner/Luncheon.

During our time at St. Joseph's, we were started on the road of discovery as to who we were and what we would become. The experiences and relationships with the Sisters of St. Joseph's, our educators, classmates, patients (now clients), all of these would help to define our existence both then and now. In short it molded us into what we would become. To paraphrase Sir Isaac Newton - ***if we have been successful in this life, this career, it has been by standing upon the shoulders of giants*** (our faculty and all those nursing graduates who preceded us).

I would ask you to stand, if you are able, to toast our Alma Mater.

Valedictory Address

Our presence here today bears witness to the fact that one day we had decided to become a nurse — to become a good nurse.

Three years ago we walked through the doors of St. Joseph's School of Nursing into a new way of life. On the threshold of this new experience, we were determined. At that time, we understood what it was to be a nurse: to have the qualities of patience, interest, kindness; the eagerness to nourish, to guide, to help. What we didn't understand was whether we could do it or not, whether we could successfully meet our responsibilities through these qualities.

S. F. Laycock, Doctor of Philosophy, writes that the fundamental responsibility of the nurse is threefold; to conserve life, to alleviate suffering, to promote health. As graduates here today, we are able to say, we have done it! We have fulfilled our responsibilities because we wanted to do it.

We have discovered that these qualities are an expression of our self — our thoughts and our ideas. We have discovered that to accomplish this goal, the nurse's task is a challenging one. Her field of knowledge must be limitless. She must know about abnormalities ranging from physical disease to mental aberration. Her greatest task is accomplished when she realizes that her patient is a complex human being, and that she also is a complex human being. If she nurses her patient as a whole person, and not as a disabled person, she will help him to emerge as a whole.

Proud?

Parent and friend, we are tremendously proud of the nursing profession. Why? Because of what nursing is — what we hope to continue to make it. Nursing is health, mental and physical health, not only in the hospital situation, but also in the community. Nursing is striving for health; for hope. Nursing is giving of oneself, fervently, desiring to live with a moral purpose. We could say our moral purpose is happiness, happiness in the love and guidance of God, happiness in those we know and love. You and you have guided us toward facing reality, toward learning the value of discipline.

We have understood. Struggling with new experiences, with fresh ideas, with conflicts, we have understood.

Hasn't it been wonderful? The joy of Undermount — midnight birthday parties with candles when there weren't supposed to be candles. The joy of the hectic move to Fontbonne — papered elevators, Sister's stern, but twinkling eye. Finally, the immeasurable excitement of Black Band! We had made it! We were Seniors, and mighty proud of it!

As Seniors, we became aware of the startling fact that the future was open to us. Wide open! It was an overwhelming thought. Contemplating our wants and desires, we have chosen general duty, specialized areas in the dramatic new fields of renal dialysis, heart surgery, nuclear medicine; or university, public health, industrial nursing, marriage.

The most difficult task for us to perform now is to somehow try to thank you. Sister Celestine, Sister Maris Stella, the best way we know how to thank you is for you to be proud of us, and to work toward sustaining and deserving that pride. To all the Sisters of St. Joseph, our teachers, the nurses and doctors — thank you for your guidance, your counseling and your faith in us.

Mother and father, aunt and uncle and friend, you have been with us for these years. We will be leaving soon, but you will be with us. Thank you.

We have reached a goal — with competence, wit, with integrity, with strength. We will not stop reaching.

And eternity in an hour.

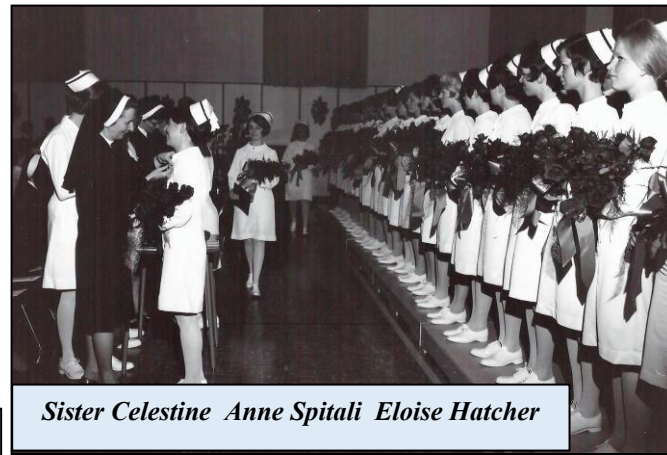

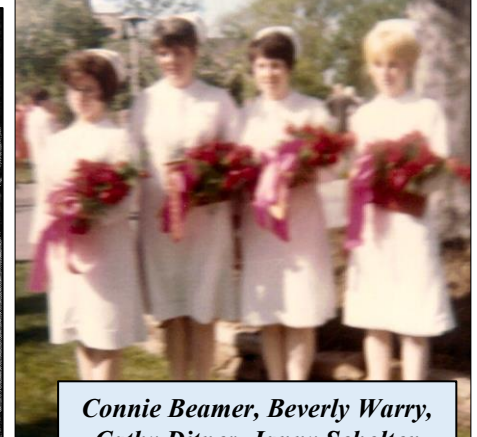

Two plus one equals success

THE 122 student nurses graduating this afternoon from St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing are a pilot group initiating the school's new 2 plus 1 program.

The program of two years of education plus a third year of service on the wards has worked out so well with the Class of '69 that it will be adopted for future classes at St. Joseph's.

One result of the change will be that third year students, who have traditionally been paid a token monthly allowance by the hospital, will begin their third year — be paid a salary of around \$300 a month.

These students will no longer live in residence with their living expenses paid by the hospital. Students in the new course will also be permitted to marry in their third year.

Highlights of today's 50th graduation exercises at Fairbairn Hall was the presentation of prizes and scholarships to four of the young women graduates.

Jane Evoy, of Port Colborne, was awarded both the prize for highest academic standing and a scholarship for post-graduate study in nursing education.

Her prize, given in memory of the late Dr. Kenneth Murray by Dr. and Mrs. J. K. Murray, was presented by Mrs. Murray. Her scholarship, given by the hospital's medical staff, was presented by Mrs. D. A. Hitch.

Jane plans to study at the University of Ottawa. She will complete the first year of the two-year course in Ottawa and then return to Hamilton at St. Joseph's Hospital. She will take the second year of the course as an extension student.

She will come back to St. Joseph's as a premarriage team leader, probably in medicine or surgery.

St. Joseph's, she explains, is trying to establish a system of upgrading the standards of team leadership and hopes eventually to have only university-trained nurses as team leaders.

Jane decided in high school, after taking a hard look at a number of professions, that nursing would offer her the personal involvement with people she wanted.

In Ottawa, she won't be living in residence, but in an apartment with other students.

"You get to the point you want to get out of the school situation... you're a little ambitious to get back to the way of life you were used to before you came into residence."

Proficiency

Judy Boulianne, Hanover, was awarded the prize for general proficiency, given in memory of the late Dr. Orton James Newell, by Dr. and Mrs. J. E. Newell. It was presented by Miss Catherine Newell.

Her nursing career will take her to The Hospital for Sick Children, Toronto.

All her walking this month hasn't been done on the wards of St. Joseph's hospital. Judy completed 24 1/2 miles in the recent Miles for Millions walk and last night she took part in the graduating class's no-sleep-a-night.

The evening began with a 10 p.m. meeting with Sisters Maris Stella and Celestine, of the nursing school, in the school auditorium.

"This is really a farewell party," explained Judy.

"Then it's traditional for the graduating class to go through the residence singing songs, trying the undergraduate and making sure nobody gets any sleep."

Mass this morning was at 8:30, followed by the graduation breakfast. From 8:30 until about 2 p.m., the graduates tried to sleep.

Graduation today follows a busy weekend of events preceding the solemn event. Banquets, balls, teas, wine and cheese parties and the graduation dance on Friday all add up to more than fun, says Judy.

"We've been living on \$15 a month, and graduation costs about \$200 when you count photographs, graduation fees, registration for exam fees, gifts to Sisters and teachers, banquets, ball gowns, hairdos, etc."

Karen Wilson, of Manning Avenue, Hamilton, was awarded the scholarship for post-graduate study in nursing administration given by the hospital auxiliary and presented by Mrs. J. J. Kelly. Karen plans to take her BSc. in Nursing at the University of Toronto before returning to St. Joseph's Hospital to teach.

"It is the way I want to help improve bedside nursing," she said.

Espo '70 in Japan is her dream.

The fourth prize-winner at today's graduation plans to live in the student "Ottawa" near McGill University in Montreal while she takes a two-year BSc. course. Her husband is in Beaconsfield.

Ingrid Thyssen's scholarship for post-graduate study in nursing administration was given by the hospital's medical staff and was presented by Sister Mary Grace, administrator.

She will return to St. Joseph's to teach but hopes, after that, to return to Montreal to live. Originally, from Holland, she is going to see the world before she marries and settles down.

"No girl should marry before 24 and no man before 28," she says.

Prophitry will be Karen's field. She's not ready to make any of the needed and costly changes in the field, herself, but wants to be part of them.

The one male graduating nurse in the class, Richard Blake, is the son of a member of the graduating class of '28. He plans to stay at St. Joseph's as a staff member on the medical floor, after graduation from Calverton Boys' High School here.

"I felt after four and a-half years because I felt too immature for the immense responsibility involved in the preschool... I didn't know I was and felt a course in nursing would help me mature."

May teach

Working towards his BA degree at McMaster at night school, Richard feels he might someday either return to the Seminary or join the Brothers of Mercy, a U.S.A. order whose main work is nursing. Or he might decide to teach nursing, eventually. There are three male nursing graduates teaching at St. Joseph's now.

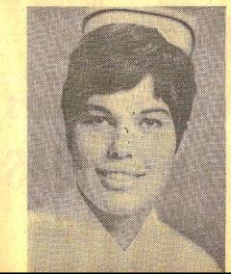
While in training at St. Joseph's, Richard became a graduate of the Society of Registered and Remedial Masseurs of Ontario.

Absent when the photo of the graduation class was taken was Sister Patrick Michael, of Hamilton.



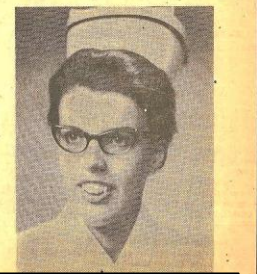

As a new grad I worked on 5 Surgical at St.Joesph's Hospital until the inception of the Renal Transplant Unit, where, under the tutelage of Dr. Peter Knight, we nurses set up the unit for our first patients. We were often "relocated" when there were no transplant patients, which meant we were required to work on any unit where help was needed. This could get pretty tense, but made for a lively and very broad experience!

I would like to thank our present and past Alumnae Executive for their dedication and hard work and I hope to contribute to keep our vital tradition alive!!!

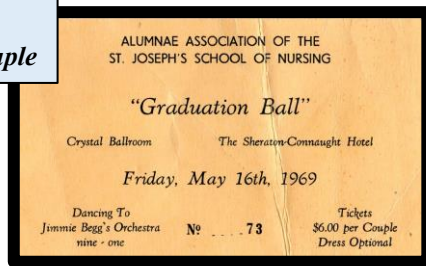

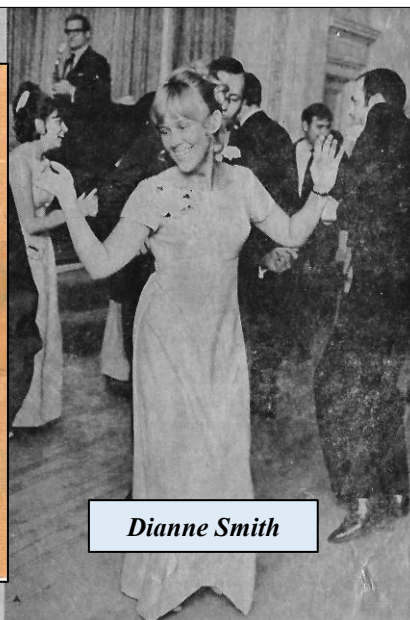

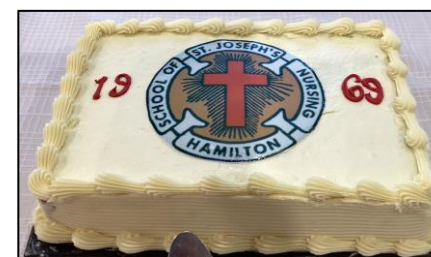
