





RE: ALUMNAE MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

PROPOSAL: To bring nursing graduates from St. Joseph's School of Nursing Campus......years '75 thru '78 to full alumnae membership eligibility (Active).

HISTORY: In late '73 nurses' education was transferred from hospitals to community colleges. As a result the students from class of '75 having already been accepted into St.J.S.N were then graduated from Mohawk College.

All classes were held at St.J.S.N and they studied the leading edge curriculum related To self-directed learning that St.Joe's had started in '71.

The classes of '76, '77, '78 were accepted into St. Joe's campus of Mohawk College
And were educated at St. Joe's but studied the new Mohawk College curriculum.
All of their clinical experience (except maybe Psychiatry) took place at St. Joe's school/ / hospital

After '78 the nursing education program was transferred to Chedoke location.

ALUMNAE MEMBERSHIP DEFINITION: (please refer to constitution or website)

- 1: Active member
- 2: Life member
- 3: Associate member.

At some time the alumnae executive committee voted to restrict all St.J.S.N. grads from '75 on to be eligible for associate membership only.

As well only graduates from St.J.S.N can serve on the executive committee according to The constitution.

PURPOSE: To give these grads appropriate recognition.

This is a group, who because of their sensitivity to being given this lower status, declined (many) to even apply for membership.

These four classes represent quite a few hundred members.....younger ..and possibly could be our future executive.

What better way to keep our alumnae alive.

VOTE: I respectively propose therefore that all St.J.S.N grads from classes...'75, '76,"'77, and '&'78 be granted eligibility for active alumnae membership.
