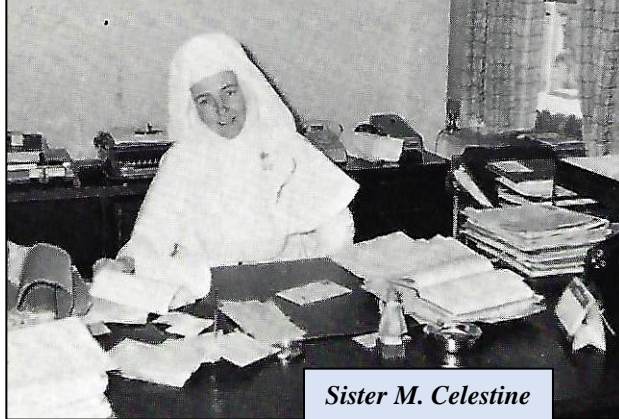




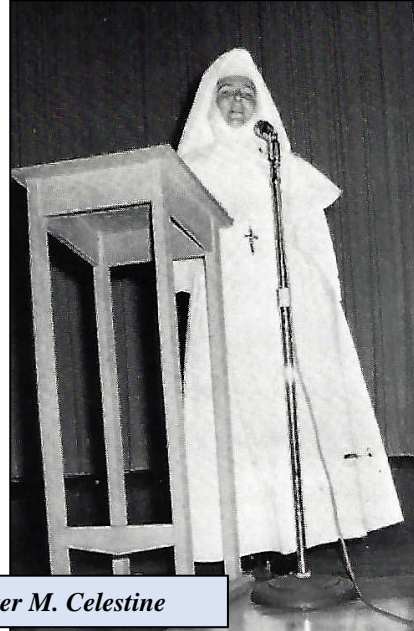

WELCOME CLASS of '67

August 26th, 1964, 7 p.m.—a typical warm summer evening. Just another night for most people, but for 128 prospective nursing students who would form the class of '67, at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, Hamilton, it was a very significant night; one that would not be forgotten. For this night, they were to begin a new way of life, —a way of life for which they had been planning, dreaming and preparing for many years.

The new students, were met by their 'big sisters' and brought to the school auditorium for the Welcoming Party. Here they were entertained by classes '65 and '66 respectively. The Class of '65 presented a skit which 'attempted' to show the lighter aspects of residence and hospital life.

Our own 'Peter, Paul and Mary', (Judy Almond, Pat Farrell and Sue Curry) alias the 'Black Widow Spiders' sang three folk songs accompanied on chorus by the audience.

A laparotomy was then performed before our eyes (under sterile technique? ? ?), by the class of '65 in which the most unusual findings was

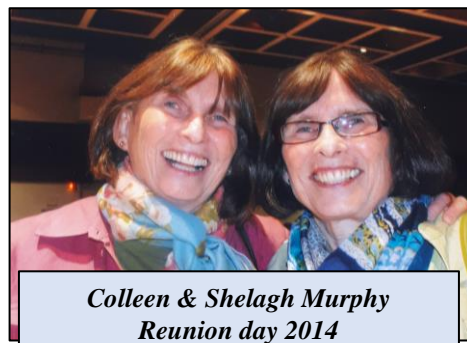

The clean-cut trio of nurses in white slacks and Ben Coker tops received proud smiles not only from their families but from bystanders.

It was the 53rd graduation of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing yesterday and the three nurses were the first men to graduate from a nursing school in Hamilton.

First Week

With 101 female classmates, Mr. David Dalginish, 23, said "The first week was the hardest, until we got adjusted."

WITH A smile, he added, "It's a good course in getting along with women."

Mr. Dalgleish and his two male classmates, Mr. Francis Demers and Mr. Stanley Benbenek, all of Hamilton, chose nursing because they feel the profession offers many fields of work to men, such as teaching, supervising, psychiatry and industry.

"Men are more stable in supervisory positions. They're less influenced by their emotions," said Mr. Dalgleish, who intends to take a course in anesthesiology at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester.

IN EUROPE, men have been in nursing since the beginning of time. It is one of the accepted professions for men. The biggest problem in Canada is the total lack of publicity. Public opinion is that nursing is not acceptable for a man, he continues.

Accommodate during training should definitely not be a problem, he stressed.

Working with his two classmates, he lives in a small apartment, across the street from the hospital, a residence for pharmacy students and interns.

Mr. Frank Demers, 29, thought male nurses "would gain stability into the profession. Women tend to get married and leave the hospital to look after their families but the men always remain the breadwinners," he said.

The Canadian Nurses' Registry in Hamilton does not have a male nurse registered and gets very few requests for male nurses.

Three male students graduated with 101 female students. They stated that they chose nursing because they feel the profession offers many fields of work to men, such as teaching, supervising, psychiatry and industry. They also stated that “men are more stable in supervisory positions. They’re less influenced by their emotion.

David Dalgleish intends to take a course in anaesthesiology at the Mayo Clinic in Rochester. Frank Demers stated "male nurses would get stability into the profession. Women tend to get married and leave the hospital to look after their families but the man always remains the breadwinner. Mr Demers had worked for 2 previous summers as an orderly. He will work at St Joseph's as a nurse in the emergency ward. Stanley Bembenek is looking for a job in industrial nursing

During training the 3 male students lived in Parham Apartments across the street from the hospital, a residence for pharmacy students and interns.

"THE COURSE is well-planned and we were well accepted by the teaching staff," said Mr. Demers, who had worked for two previous summers as an orderly before he realized there were opportunities for him in nursing. His sister, Sister Mary Michael, is a nursing graduate of 1962.

He will work at St. Joseph's as a nurse in the emergency

All three stressed that they are nurses by choice, not because they are frustrated doctors who couldn't make it.

Following their self-soled foot-prints in the hospital corridors are the four male students in the other years.

Mr. Richard Blake, of Hamilton, is in first year, the only man in a class of 194. He admits to feeling set apart because "the girls can work together as a team" but he feels this a minor disadvantage.

"It's a field where men with abilities of direction can do so much. It's not just hard work, but specialized fields that can lead into administration," he

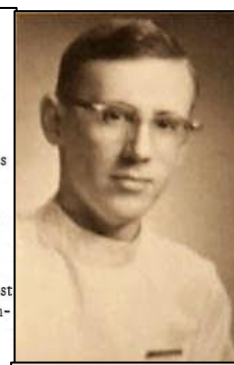
As Canadians, we join in the memories of years gone by; of times both good and bad. Great wars, failures and triumphs are part of our heritage.

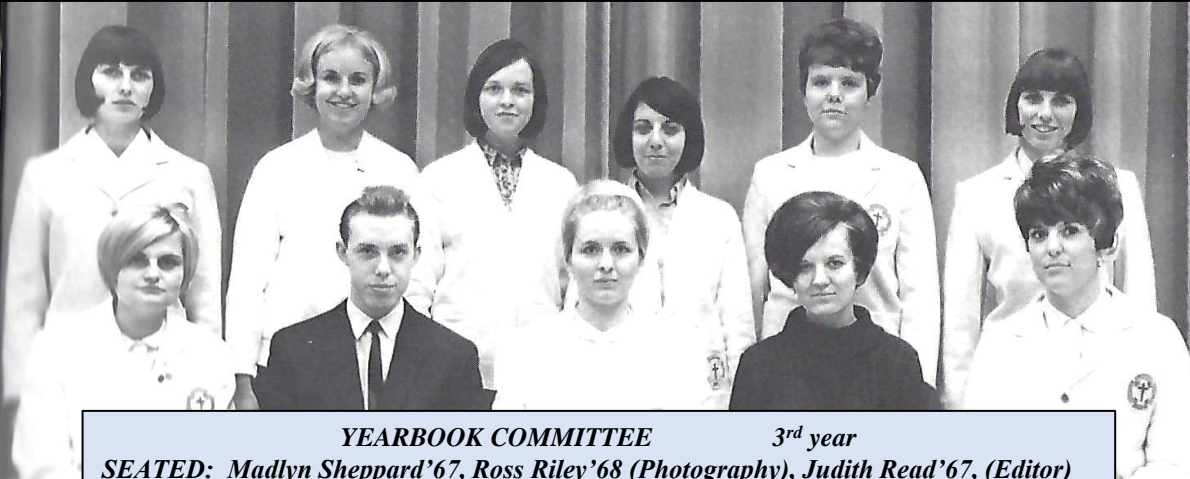
Our other responsibility was to get a speaker for the school meetings. Just prior to Christmas we arranged a hobby and craft night for the students.

Three years ago when we entered St. Joseph's School of Nursing, we were timid, shy and perhaps even frightened but we had one goal in mind. Each had made the very important decision to become a nurse.

Today, especially, we remember each step that has brought us to this, our Graduation Day - our first class, the pride and joy of receiving our caps, the move from Undermount to Fontbonne Hall, the year pins and then our Black Bands and school rings. We were finally Seniors!

Time has gone by so quickly.

Now, today, we are faced with another very important decision:

Of the varied and numerous fields of nursing open to us, which one shall we choose?

Will it be nursing in a General Hospital or will it be Postgraduate study?

Will it be public Health Nursing? Industrial Nursing? Nursing in a Medi Clinic or Nursing in the Armed Forces?

Two important questions once again are examined as we contemplate the choice.

What is a nurse? - We believe a nurse is one who nourishes, fosters and protects but above all one who must be willing to give of self. As a nurse one becomes a part of all that has implication for health in our society. It is in the giving of self and in the application of the knowledge and skills that we have learned that we will make our greatest contribution to our patients, our profession, our families and ourselves.

And then we ask, what is nursing? In the words of Virginia Henderson noted nurse - author and educator "Nursing is assisting the individual, sick or well in those activities contributing to health that he would normally perform, unaided, if he had the necessary strength, will or knowledge - and to assist in such a way as to help him gain independence as rapidly as possible."

Nursing means caring for people who have health problems. It means assisting the patient and his family by being the consciousness of the unconscious, the leg of the amputee, the eyes of the newly blind and welcome comforter of the lonely.

Nursing means understanding and supporting.

Nursing is "being there when needed"; being available to help alleviate fears and anxieties; listening to a worried and distraught patient and helping him to develop a positive attitude toward his problem.

Nursing is also a teaching profession. Society's greatest evil regarding health is ignorance, and education of the public is the most effective remedy.

Gratifying as it is, nursing is a challenge to us, both to the physical and mental components of our nature. It is a service profession given with and for others.

There have been many, over these past three years, who have had our best interests at heart - both at home and within this hospital complex and school of nursing.

And it is for this assistance that we wish to express our gratitude today.

We are indebted to you Mother and Dad for all your encouragement and support. When we needed someone to share our joys and frustrations, you were always there.

We are proud and happy to share the joys of this day with you.

We would like to express our sincere appreciation to Sister Celestine, our director, and to the Sisters of St. Joseph. We have had the advantage of these modern educational and clinical facilities, of this beautiful and progressive teaching hospital.

To our Teachers, the doctors, the graduates and our patients we thank you for the vast nursing and personal knowledge which we will take with us to the numerous and varied fields in nursing.

Today we are Graduate nurses. The many memories of our past three years will always be for us a quiet retreat where we can find peace and the courage to meet the future.

We cannot hope to reach our chosen goal for the future in a day. It may take months or even years, but we must be determined never to be driven back quite so far as we have advanced towards our goal.

And most important, we must bear in mind, that all this has and will become a reality under the guidance of Him Who is Eternal Truth.

In closing, I would like to leave you with this thought:

The nurse is one -

Who cares

Who soothes

Who understands - the tired ear
the fevered lips
the trembling hands

Who ministers and calms

Who listens; never blames

Who prays; helps in every way - confused and troubled
minds, pain laden, weary bodies, and souls far astra
This is one, who is the nurse.

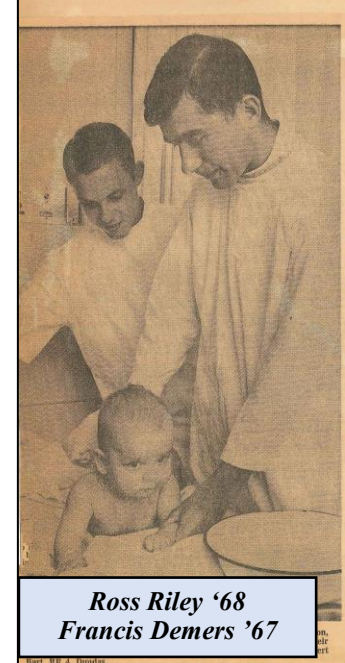

WHEN Mr. Francis Demers, of Hamilton, advises students to become nurses, he is speaking particularly to men.

Mr. Demers is one of six young men training in the School of Nursing at St. Joseph's Hospital here. All but one are from Hamilton or suburbs.

The son of Mr. and Mrs. Louis Demers, 35 Triton Street, Francis, who is in his third year of training, received his first hospital working experience as an orderly during summer vacations from high school.

NURSING, for him, is a "real job," he believes.

"It has a great future," he says.

Two careers he mentions with pride are administration and teaching. He has had no decision on his specialty.

Satisfaction, sometimes considered low for men, do not worry him, for he thinks they can only go one way, and that is up.

For a nursing career, however, he says men have to do postgraduate work.

"HE HAS HAD no position in being accepted by patients or female nurses. Men patients often prefer a male nurse, he feels.

Mr. Demers advises any boy considering nursing to work for a month as an orderly, then as a night aide in a hospital ward, and helps him to be sure of his choice.

A relatively small number of male nurses in employment in local hospitals.

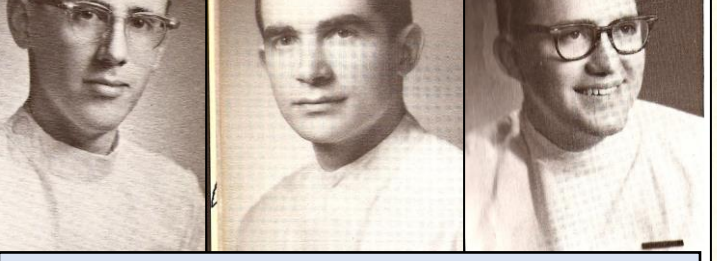

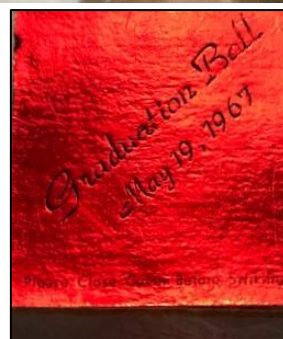

TOAST TO THE ALMA MATER BY JANET COTE '67

Sisters, honoured guests, Alumnae members and Executive.
May 17, 1967- 50 years ago!

Ella Kelly, the 1st Alumnae President would be surprised that St Joseph's School of Nursing Alumnae would exist for 102 years and still have over 510 active members! There are 61 members present from our Centennial Class of 1967. In 1964, 115 young female high school graduates including 4 young men, began a 3 year journey that would be life changing. A crazy time! The first 4 male students lived at Parham Residence and wore white uniforms. The 115 females lived in Undermount, under strict rules.

The lounge, a favourite, was a place to meet new friends, where forever friendships were forged. We celebrated all special events. We got dressed in our complicated student uniforms. Would we ever make breakfast in time for classes, even with that dreadful tunnel?

Time flew. We completed modules and immediately practised what we learned. The days were long with early lights out. Weekend curfew posed problems for social outings - memories of racing to make curfew. In the middle of our second year, we moved to Fontbonne Hall, with all new amenities. The auditorium/gym housed volleyball, a pool table, monthly dances with live bands, Christmas concerts - Red Rose Ball and Black Band Dance. We completed all the specialties - no choices! We trekked uphill to Psych., or stood on stools to assist in the O.R. We learned triage in Emerg., experienced full moons in Labour and Delivery, and hated giving injections to toddlers in Pediatrics. Our class was famous for: first male students, the Murphy twins, emergency meetings called to correct behaviors, our unusual gift to Sister Celestine, Buster the 1st pet therapy dog and the smoke alarm fiasco at Fontbonne.

Despite everything, we graduated. Many thought, upon receiving our diplomas, that we had scaled a mountain. In hindsight, it was just a molehill compared to what came next in our professional and our personal lives. Many graduates went on to university, others to local hospitals - all had full time jobs. The knowledge base changed q 4-5 yrs. in 1967. Now it is more frequent - new medications, treatments, vaccines, syndromes, and surgical procedures that altered outcomes.

In 2017, the practise of registered nurses has changed dramatically. Many procedures that we performed, as nurses, new technology has replaced. If technology fails???

As graduate nurses, we influenced health care, health education, health promotion, patient advocacy and community support, locally and globally. The 1967 class has many BSCNs, and Masters degrees, a Pediatrician, a lawyer, nurse specialists in traditional and non- traditional areas. All from a class who questioned everything.

Sadly, death has claimed 8 of our 1967 graduates. In memory of them and to honour them, we have donated \$1,135 donation to the Alumnae. In Judy Harvey Kaufman's 1967 valedictory address she defined a nurse as one who cares, who soothes, who understands the tired ear, the fevered lips, the trembling hands. One who listens and never blames, who prays, who helps in every way, for the confused and troubled minds, pain laden and weary bodies and souls gone astray.

Let us toast our Alma Mater and our hard- working Alumnae.

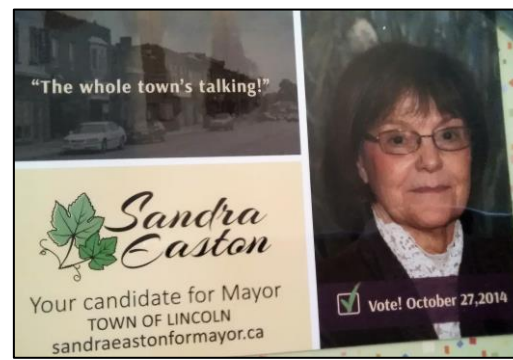
