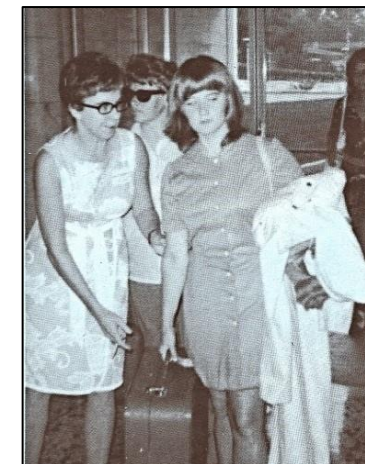
*Eva Neal was a graduate of St. Joseph's School of Nursing in the class of 1951.

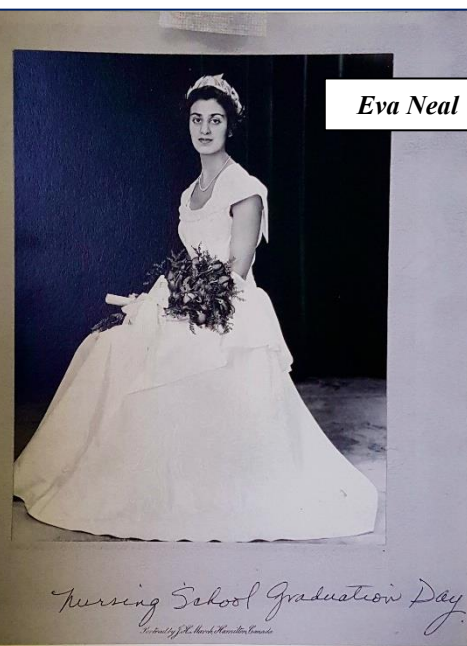

*Marion LaSueur was a graduate of St Joseph School of Nursing, with the class of 1951.
 She worked in the Operating Room and was an excellent O.R. nurse.
 Marion was the instructor for the St Joseph nursing students in the mid 1950s.
 She was expecting her 3rd child when her husband passed away.*

*Sister Virginia offered her the position of "Registrar" for the School of Nursing, tailored to her home needs.
 Sister Virginia sent Marion to workshops to develop the position of Registrar, a first for St Joseph's School of Nursing.
 She was dedicated to this position, had a good sense of humour, was compassionate to the students.
 She was a hard worker and kept the enrolment high.*

*As Registrar, she organized the assessment for admission to the programme.
 Later, she would measure students for uniform.
 She continued on in the role of Registrar until the fall of 1973 when it was announced that the community colleges
 would take over diploma nursing education.
 Marion went to teach the RNA programme when she left St. Joseph's.*

Advisory Board from 1966 - 1967



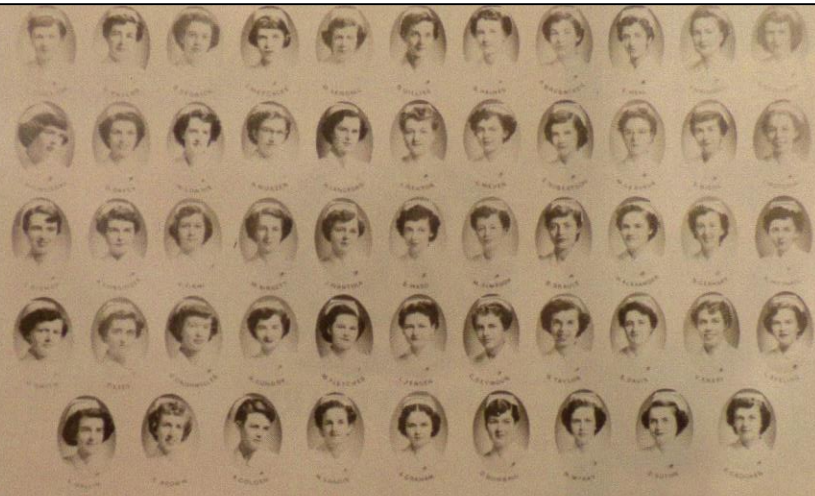

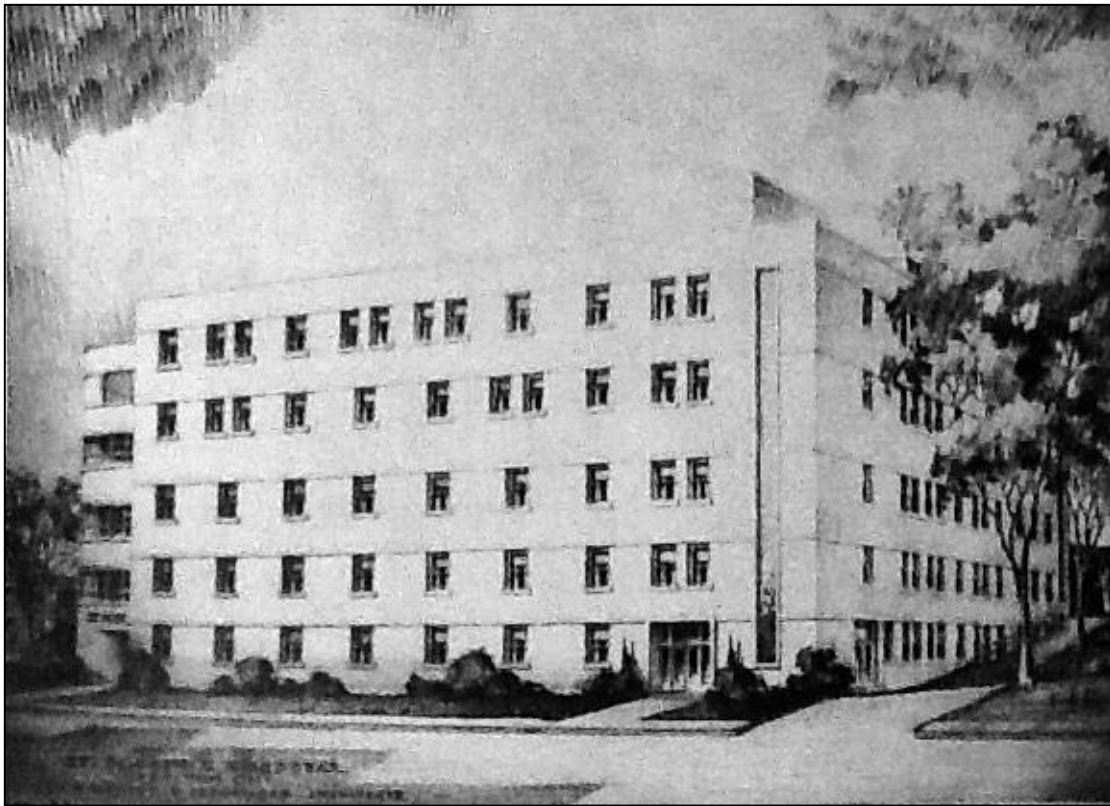

Maternity Wing

May 24, 1951

New Maternity wing was opened.

It was 4 times the size of the Casa Maria located on Charlton Avenue and was built in an L-shape around the Casa Maria.

Patient accomodation was now 457 and 102 bassinettes.

The Casa Maria building was demolished.

The new maternity and gynecological wing was officially opened May 24, 1951

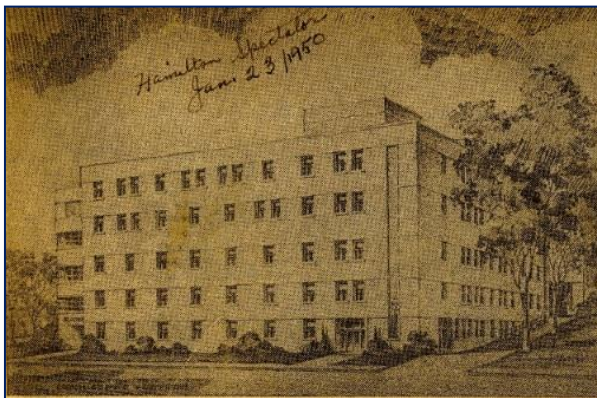
by His Excellency, Bishop Ryan.

Following the opening ceremonies, the guests toured the new wing, guided by the staff nurses.

The event closed with tea in the nurses cafeteria.

Sister M. Geraldine said the site of the Casa Maria will be used for parking.

Old Casa Maria Is Being Razed Was Bisby Home

Use Site Now As Parking Ground

Razing operations on Casa Maria, where many younger Hamiltonians were born, have now begun. Housing the maternity section of the St. Joseph's Hospital, the old building has now given place to the new maternity wing, opened May 24. In site will be used as parking space, said Sister M. Geraldine, supervisor of the hospital. The hospital authorities would like to keep it as a lawn-covered court, she added. But lack of parking space prevented it.

In use as a maternity hospital since 1924, Casa Maria was at one time the residence of the late Mr. and Mrs. G. H. Bisby, on Haessle Street, later Charlton Avenue.

Set in grounds it was one of the fine residences of its day. Its furnishings included the fine Carlo Della painting of the Virgin and Child which remained when the building was turned into a hospital.

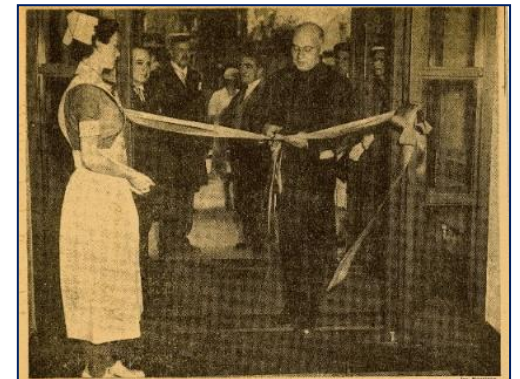
Old-fashioned from the view point of present-day hospital architecture, Casa Maria, which means House of Mary, was noted for its first-class record in keeping down infection and its average stay of 8.7 days for maternity cases. This latter was one of the lowest in Ontario.

Casa Maria's first Caesarian birth was performed by Dr. Norman McKelroy in its first week of operation. Its first pair of twins was born in March, 1925, with Dr. Herbert H. Sullivan attending. Its only set of triplets was born February 17, 1929.
