



The cruelty of the world passes by me unnoticed.




#### Nursing book features new learning method

To facilitate self-directed learning Betty McInnes developed many slide-tape programs and videotapes on anatomy and physiology and nursing skills to facilitate independent learning. As well, she wrote two books "Medical Asepsis" and "The Vital Signs" which students used as independent

resources to learn the theory and skill of handwashing, isolation techniques and each of the vital signs.


A new self-directed two year program began at St Joseph School of Nursing.

They identified what they needed to learn in biology, nursing and clinical nursing. They were evaluated by pre-and post-tests based on these objectives.

Students were given modules with objectives requiring knowledge, comprehension and application of information.







#### The changing face of nursing

MEMORIES FLOWED like sweet wine yesterday as 800 graduates of St. Joseph's Hospital School of Nursing got together to celebrate the hospital's centennial and the 75th anniversary of the first graduating class. May Mitchell Lewis 77, and her daughter Francie Lewis Palmer, 39, are graduates of the school and beth love surviving.

both love nursing.

But while they share the love, their recollections of their profession are quite different.

Two years after her graduation in 1937, Mrs. Le-Two years anter ner graduation in 1937, Mrs. Le-wis found herself in the middle of the Second World War after volunteering to join the Canadian Army Medical Corps. After three years in England she was transferred to North Africa, where she and 80 other nurses set up a 1,200-bed tent hospital, in tempera-tures nearing 43C (110F), for Canadian casualities from the Allied investor of Science.

"We were involved in general nursing care, looking after injuries from the war zone, malaria, small pox and various other diseases they would pick up. We had 12,000 to 15,000 patients at a time," she

St Joseph School of Nursing will have 2 graduations in 1971.

Students who entered the school in September of 1968 will graduate in the Two – Plus – One program completing their year after graduation.

Sister Maris Stella, Director of St Joseph School of Nursing received word from the Ontario Hospital Services Commission and the College of Nurses in the fall of 1970,

that the present Two - Plus - One program will be phased out following the 1971 spring graduations.

Students who entered St Joseph's School of Nursing in September 1968 completed the Two-Plus-One Program. Following the notice from the Ontario Hospital Services Commission & the College of Nurses the class became known as the Class of 1971 A.

They lived in Undermount for the 1st year & then in Fontbonne for their 2nd year.

They provided their own housing for the 3rd year.

Their 3<sup>rd</sup> year was an internship year. When they left for the summer of 1970, they submitted applications to the hospital. These applications were for 6 months in a specialty area & 6 months in a general surgical or medical rotation.

They were paid as hospital employees for approximately \$300 a month

They wrote their Registration exams in May 1971
They graduated as Registered Nurses, June 11, 1971 at Mohawk College.
They began their careers as Registered Nurses.

Students who entered St Joseph's School of Nursing in September 1969 had entered the Two-Plus-One Program
Following the notice from the Ontario Hospital Services commission & the College or Nurses
the class became known as the Class of 1971B
A small number of students lived in Undermount for the 1st year while the majority lived in Fontbonne.
All the students lived in Fontbonne during their 2nd year.

The class become the graduates of the school's first two year course.






#### TWO YEAR PROGRAM GRADUATES 106 NURSES.


Graduates of St Joseph's School of Nursing became a part of nursing history when they received their diplomas at a graduation ceremony this afternoon at Mohawk College auditorium.
